

GMADA takes possession of road

With GMADA taking over the possession of the 150-foot-wide road separating Sectors 77 and 78, area residents are now hopeful of its construction soon.

Confirming the development, Vini Mahajan, Addi-

tional Chief Secretary, Department of Housing & Urban Development, and Vice Chairperson, GMADA, said the work on constructing a new metalled road would start soon.

"The road would offer reprieve to commuters," said Mahajan, adding that the road would also ease out the

congestion on the Sohana-Mohali stretch and the Airport Road, as the new road would offer an alternative route to travellers.

Satbir Singh Dhanoa, the local councilor, said, "We hope the road will come up soon now. Other roads in the area also need repairs, which should be conducted."

GMADA takes possession of Sec 77-88 dividing road

MOHALI: The Greater Mohali Area Development Authority (GMADA) on Monday took possession of the road dividing Sectors 77 and 88.

The move has paved the way for metalling of the 150ft wide dividing road.

Besides making travelling convenient, the road will also ease the congestion on Sohana-Mohali stretch and airport road as it will offer an alternate route to com-

muters. A team led by estate officer Baljeet Singh Walia oversaw the takeover.

The process was conducted peacefully without any resistance by residents.

Meanwhile, GMADA has served notices to encroachers who had illegally occupied a land in Manouli village.

Additional chief secretary (housing) Vini Mahajan said, "Stern action will be taken against the occupants if they do not vacate the land in the prescribed time period."
