

CONTINUING THE series of conducting auctions every month, PUDA and all other Special Urban Development Authorities under the Housing and Urban Development Department - GMADA, PDA, GLADA, ADA, JDA and BDA -- will conduct the e-auction of properties from March 1 to 11. A mix of industrial, residential and commercial properties situated across the state would be offered in the e-auction.

PUDA, other urban development authorities to hold e-auction from today

For participating in the e-auction, interested bidders shall have to register themselves on the e-auction portal of the department puda.e-auctions.in. Bidders shall have the option to pay the earnest money through RTGS, NEFT, credit card or debit card, an official spokesperson said here on Wednesday.

To bring transparency in disposal of properties and for the convenience of the bidders, in 2017, the department had switched from the traditional process of conducting manual auctions to e-auction. Experiment of e-auction has resulted in wider participation of bidders in the auctions. It has proved beneficial for the department also as from the 10 e-auctions conducted so far, the department has earned revenue of around Rs 1800 crore.

Properties being put on e-auction include hotel site, school sites, industrial plots booths, SCO, SCF, SCS, single storey shops, double storey shops, convenient shops and residential plots located at Mohali, Patiala, Ludhiana, Jalandhar, Bathinda, Amritsar, Mansa, Malout, Batala, Gurdaspur, Nabha, Kapurthla and Phillaur.

Under jurisdiction of Greater Mohali Area Development Authority, industrial plots of Sector 83-Alpha would be available for bidding, besides SCO, SCF, SSS, booths and residential plots situated in different sectors of Mohali.

GMADA e-auction from March 1 to 11

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MOHALI: The Greater Mohali Area Development Authority (GMADA) will be conducting an e-auction of industrial, commercial and residential plots from March 1 to 11 in line with the e-auction by development authorities across the state.

In addition to industrial plots in Sector 83-Alpha, shop-cum-offices (SCOs), shop-cum-floors (SCFs), single-storey shops (SSS), booths and residential plots situated in different sectors of Mohali will be available for bidding.

Other development authorities, including Punjab Urban Development Authority (PUDA), Patiala Development Authority (PDA), Greater Ludhiana Area Development Authority (GLADA), Amritsar Development Authority (ADA), Jalandhar Development Authority

(JDA) and Bathinda Development Authority (BDA) will conduct the e-auction of properties in Patiala, Ludhiana, Jalandhar, Bathinda, Amritsar, Mansa, Malout, Batala, Gurdaspur, Nabha, Kapurthala and Phillaur.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

For participating in the e-auction, interested bidders have to register themselves on the e-auction portal of the department—puda.e-auctions.in.

Bidders have the option to pay the earnest money through RTGS (real time gross settlement), NEFT (national electronic funds transfer), credit card or debit card.

The department had switched from the traditional manual auctions to e-auctions in 2017 to bring transparency. "From the 10 e-auctions conducted so far, the department has earned a revenue of around ₹1,800 crore," claimed an official press release.
