

GMADA issues NoCs to applicants for regularisation

MOHALI: The Greater Mohali Area Development Authority (GMADA), on Wednesday, held a camp to address the problems being faced by the residents living in colonies and building owners wanting to get their projects regularised.

Residents having properties under the jurisdiction of the authority attended the camp in Committee Hall, Punjab Urban Planning and Development Authority (PUDA) Bhawan, Sector 62, Mohali.

During the camp, applicants whose cases pertaining to regu-

larisation of buildings were found eligible, were given no objection certificates (NoCs) by the estate officer, Rohit Gupta.

Estate officer said that applicants whose documents were pending were told to submit them.

Gupta instructed the staff to submit the reports of residents who have applied for regularisation for further processing.

He further directed them to expedite the disposal of pending cases.

"I appeal to the building holders having properties in unapproved projects to attend the camps being held every Wednesday so that they could be assisted in applying for regularisation," Gupta said.

"GMADA will hold a camp on August 14 at 11am in the same venue," Gupta added.

GREATER MOHALI Area Development Authority (GMADA) conducted its weekly camp on Wednesday to address problems faced by the plot or building owners in getting their projects and plots regularised. The camp was attended by various property owners, who own properties in different projects under the jurisdiction of the authority.

During the camp, owners whose problems were addressed in the previous camp were apprised about the progress made in their cases in the week's time. They were also informed about the details about the next course of action to be adopted in their cases. The owners expressed their satisfaction over the process and hailed the initiative of public camps.

Applicants, whose cases pertained to regularisation of plots and buildings and were in order and thus, eligible for regularisation, were given the No Objection Certificates (NoCs)

during the camp by Rohit Gupta, Estate Officer (Regulatory). Other applicants, who inquired about the status of their applications were updated with the information. The ones having pendency of documents were informed about the same and were told to submit the documents as early as possible so that their cases could also be disposed of.

EO Gupta instructed the field staff to pay visits to the projects, whose promoters had submitted the application for regularisation. They were also directed to submit their reports for further processing. He also told the office staff to expedite the disposal of pending cases.

The EO appealed to the developers of the unauthorised colonies and plot holders having properties in unapproved projects to attend the camps which are held on every Wednesday and bring their problems to the notice of the Estate Office, so that they can be assisted in applying for regularisation.

GMADA will hold another camp on next Wednesday.
